Demonstrate the ability to outline and defend a vision of policies in areas such as defence, nuclear, foreign, cyber, science & technology in security purposes. 4. Critically assess the actions of actors in the Indian Ocean region. 5. Demonstrate the ability to interpret, locate, evaluate, generate, and use sociologically relevant data to test hypotheses and draw evidence-based conclusions. 6. After the completion of the course, students will be able to demonstrate knowledge of a range of pedagogical approaches for teaching Defence Studies. 7. Implement lesson sequences, assessment activities, and other requirements during a period of supervised professional experience. 8. Student will be able to understand the links between defence sector and economic models of demand. It will also help in understanding the efficiency and equity implications of arms market interference, including government policy. 9.
